NAIST Education Policy

● Objectives

As a graduate institution without undergraduate courses, NAIST promotes cutting edge research and offers a sophisticated outcome-based education for each student so as to contribute to the advancement of science and technology and of society as a whole.

● Educational mission

NAIST was founded in October 1991 as a graduate institution which educates individuals who will contribute to the development of advanced science and technology. Research and education at NAIST covers the three core areas: information science, biological science and materials science.

In order to realize a suitable standard of living for people throughout the world in the 21st century, and indeed to secure our very survival, the coming generation of leading researchers must possess the highest scientific and technical competence, along with a clear grounding in professional ethics. At NAIST, we aim to cultivate such researchers and educators.

Therefore, in addition to the areas of information science, biological science and materials science, we actively encourage interdisciplinary research and provide educational training in the principles of ethics and intellectual property.

● Objectives for individual students

◆ Prospective students

We are looking for students, researchers or engineers who have fundamental academic skills, a clear vision, a resolve toward the future and a strong interest and motivation for advanced science and technology regardless of their background. Especially, we actively accept applicants who have a strong interest in making the best use of their wide breadth of expertise to solve various problems facing society, and are aiming to be active in various fields of advanced science and technology.

◆ Basic admissions policy

In order to select outstanding persons with the above qualifications both domestically and abroad, we stress assessment of applicants' character and capability. There are various routes for admission, including examinations centered upon interviews as well as examinations based on recommendations.

2. Qualifications for Application

- (1) Those who hold a master's degree or a *professional degree. (*Stipulated in the Rules for Degrees, Article 5-2 (1953 Ministry of Education Ordinance, No. 9) in accordance with the School Education Act, Article 104-3.)
- (2) Those who will be conferred a master's degree or a professional degree by March 31, 2026.
- (3) Those who hold the equivalent of a master's degree or a professional degree in foreign country.
- (4) Those who will be conferred the equivalent of a master's degree or professional degree in a foreign country by March 31, 2026.
- (5) Those who hold the equivalent of a master's degree or a professional degree by taking a foreign university's correspondence course in Japan.
- (6) Those who, by March 31, 2026, will be conferred the equivalent of a master's degree or a professional degree by taking a foreign university's correspondence course in Japan.
- (7) Those who have completed their course and have been conferred the equivalent of a master's degree at a foreign educational institute in Japan authorized by the educational system of the foreign country and specified separately by the Minister of MEXT.
- (8) Those who will complete their course and will be conferred the equivalent of a master's degree by March 31, 2026 at a foreign educational institute in Japan authorized by the educational system of the foreign country and specified separately by Minister of MEXT.
- (9) Those who will complete their course and will be conferred a master's degree of the United Nations University established under the United Nations general assembly resolution on December 11, 1972 (here in after call "United Nations University") (1972 law No.72) in accordance with Special Measures Incidental to Enforcement of the Agreement between the United Nations and Japan regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations University Act, Article 1-2.
- (10) Those who will complete their course and will be conferred a master's degree by March 31, 2026 at a United Nations University.
- (11) Those who have completed their course at a foreign university/educational institute which is specified in (7) or at the United Nations University, and have passed the equivalent of an examination, screening, etc. specified in the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools Article 16-2 (1974 Ministry of Education Ordinance, No. 28), being recognized as having an academic ability equivalent or superior to a master's degree.
- (12) Those who will complete their course at a foreign university/educational institute which is specified in (7) or at the United Nations University, and will pass the equivalent of an examination,

screening, etc. specified in the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools Article 16-2 (1974 Ministry of Education Ordinance, No. 28) by March 31, 2026, being recognized as having an academic ability equivalent or superior to a master's degree.

- (13) Those who are deemed eligible by the Minister of MEXT. (1989 Ministry of Education Ordinance, No. 118)
- ① Those who have engaged in research for more than 2 years at a university, or a research institute, etc. after graduating from a university, and are thereby recognized as having an academic ability equivalent or superior to a master's degree or a professional degree. (See Note 2)
 - ② Those who have engaged in research for more than 2 years at a university or a research institute, etc. after having completed a 16-year curriculum of foreign school education or having taken a foreign school's correspondence course in Japan, and are thereby recognized as having an academic ability either equivalent or superior to a master's degree or a professional degree. (See Note 2)
- (14) Those who are recognized by NAIST through the Preliminary Screening of Applicant Suitability to have an academic ability equivalent or superior to a master's degree or a professional degree, and who will be at least 24 years old by March 31, 2026. (See Note 2)

*1. The date for applicants for Fall Admission is September 30, 2026, specified in the "Qualifications for Application (2), (4), (6), (8), (10), (12), (14) above.

*2. Applicants who wish to apply based on qualifications (13) or (14) should follow the procedures given in **Article 11: Preliminary Screening of Applicant Suitability (for applicants who meet qualification (13) and (14))** on page 11 before taking the entrance examination.

11. Long-Term Completion System

The Long-Term Completion System is a system for students who have difficulty completing their graduate courses within the standard allotted period due to employment responsibilities or other

reasons. The System aims to aid students in creating their study plan over the standard period and ensure they finish their courses.

Students in doctoral course may extend for up to three years. These extensions will enable students to receive degrees in accordance with their plans.

When newly enrolled students apply for this system, the total tuition fee for the standard period will be divided into the number of the years permitted by NAIST.
